Appointed in August 2024 by ACMAD's Board of Governors, the new General Manager, Dr. Ousmane Ndiaye, officially assumed his duties on December 17 at the center, where the entire staff gathered to welcome him and wish him success in his mission. Dr. Ousmane Ndiaye, who previously served as the Director of the Senegal Meteorological Service (ANACIM) since 2019, will now lead the African Center of Meteorological Applications for Development (ACMAD) for a four-year term. Dr. Ndiaye's vision for ACMAD is to establish it as a center of excellence, leveraging cutting-edge climate science technologies, including artificial intelligence, seamless climate predictions ranging from a few hours to several decades. His approach emphasizes strong collaboration to adapt climate information for informed decision-making across all temporal and spatial scales.

#### Message from ACMAD's new Director General



It was a great pleasure to return to Niamey after about 15 years and to see with joy the new infrastructure in the city. I found a very enthusiastic and warm team at <u>ACMAD</u>, and I was even treated to a welcome dinner (free) the night before. Two meetings with the staff gave me an idea of the current state of the institution and the challenges ahead in terms of institutional, infrastructural, human, and material resources.

During my first week, I visited the Senegalese Embassy in Niger. I was warmly received by Mr. Baldé (business officer) and his very open and welcoming team, who briefed me on the country, the Senegalese community, and even Senegalese restaurants. Mr. Baldé and Colonel Traoré

were very accommodating. I then visited my colleague and brother, Mr. Lawan, Director of Meteorology, who introduced me to His Excellency, the Minister of Transport and Equipment. My meeting with Colonel Major Salissou Mahaman Salissou allowed me to appreciate the warm Nigerien hospitality and the principles of collaboration with this country, which are straightforward and aligned with the country's priorities. Shortly after, I was invited to the end of the year celebration of the women of civil aviation, where I met the Director General of ANAC.

I also received a delegation from the Liptako-Gourma Authority (covering Mali, Niger, and Burkina Faso), led by my colleague Dr. Yaka Pascal, as part of the implementation of the "Regional Program on Climate Security in the Western Sahel." We discussed the impact of climate variability on security issues. I found the idea very original and hope to collaborate further in this regard. In the second week, I began working with a focus on potential collaborators. First, I had a discussion with the Pan-African Farmers' Organization (PAFO), which invited me to a seminar in Uganda that includes the signing of an MoU. I held a working session with the Regional Director of UN-Habitat, Dr. Oumar Sylla, a long-time friend, where we laid the groundwork for collaboration between our two institutions on climate and habitat issues. I also visited Dr. Issoufou BAOUA, the Acting Director General of the AGRHYMET Regional Center, to introduce myself. I met someone very open to strengthening our collaboration, aiming for more synergy in our actions to be more effective and quicker in serving populations in the context of significant climate variability. This end-of-year period is not very conducive to meeting UN agencies and accredited embassies in Niger, but I managed to have some exchanges via WhatsApp (ICPAC, SADC-CS, OACPS, etc.).

Next month also promises to be busy, starting with the PAFO invitation in Uganda, followed by the American Meteorological Society (AMS) conference in New Orleans at the invitation of NOAA. The program includes an audience with the NOAA Administrator and the Director of the US Weather Service, Dr. Wassila Thiaw, as well as the celebration of the 80th birthday of my former professor, Mark Cane. The month ended with the celebration of the retirement of our security officer, Mr. Agali Mohamed. We wish him the best, and special thanks to the women who prepared the celebration so well.

We continue to work towards achieving the center's strategic vision, the payment of member states' arrears, the ratification of the ACMAD charter, and our collaboration with Pan-African organizations and regional climate centers.

#### ACMAD at COP29: Strengthening Climate Resilience through Collaboration



The ACMAD delegation had the privilege of participating in a series of side events and bilateral meetings with key partners, including the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), the African Union Commission, ClimSA, the European Union, and the Risk-Informed Early Action Partnership (REAP).

These exchanges provided a valuable platform to showcase major initiatives underway at ACMAD to promote climate services and enhance the integration of climate policies across Africa.

One of the highlights of COP29 was ACMAD's organization and facilitation of a side event under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). The event focused on multi-hazard early warning systems and climate financing, in collaboration with the Global Water Partnership and ICPAC.

The event underscored Africa's remarkable progress in advancing climate resilience. Innovative tools, such as the Drought Monitoring Tool, essential for tracking drought conditions on the continent, were presented. Discussions also explored practical solutions for increasing climate financing, enhancing early warning systems, and building trust with users by demonstrating the tangible benefits of these systems in saving lives and reducing vulnerabilities.

#### **Engagement with the WMO**

Another key moment was the audience granted by the WMO Deputy Secretary-General to the ACMAD delegation, led by its new Director General, Dr. Ousmane Ndiaye.

These discussions emphasized the importance of collaboration, capacity building, and innovation in strengthening Africa's resilience to climate change. Through these engagements, ACMAD reaffirmed its commitment to fostering partnerships and delivering impactful climate services across the continent.



#### A LOOK BACK AT SOME KEY **EVENTS**

#### Side Event at the African Pavilion at COP29 on the mainstreaming of Climate Information

ACMAD partnered with ClimSA to host a dynamic discussion on the integration of climate information into policies across Africa. The event emphasized the urgent need to make weather and climate information accessible and effectively integrated into socio-economic sectors to enhance resilience.

The session also highlighted examples of best practices developed across the continent, showcasing successful approaches to strengthening climate-informed decision-making and fostering sustainable development.

#### **Side Event at the ICPAC Pavilion** on Drought Early Warning **Systems**

During a side event organized by ICPAC on drought early warning systems, we highlighted the critical link between the continental drought monitoring system and regional systems. we presented concrete examples, including early warnings issued for severe drought conditions in Southern Africa earlier this

At the Caribbean Pavilion, ACMAD shared the outcomes of its capacity-building initiatives for national meteorological services. Among the key achievements, 42 experts from 19 countries and 11 AIMS students were trained through the ClimSA program on forecasting, monitoring, and producing advisory bulletins.
